FAQ about our Gideon moment

Philippians 4:19 "My God will meet all your needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus."

Q: What is this "Gideon moment" that everyone is talking about?

A: There are two criteria to a Gideon moment. First, that God has given us a mission. Discover Church's mission is "Inviting all people to discover their full life in Christ." Second, that the mission is of such a size that we must look to God to provide the resources. Discover Church is facing such a moment. It is the reason why the Church Council called for a week of prayer and fasting last month to ask God to provide the resources to accomplish our mission.

Q: How do you think the week of prayer and fasting went?

A: Great! I was very heartened by the involvement of the congregation, both for the entire week and for the twenty four hours of prayer. I had multiple people come up to me and share how the Lord spoke to them during that week.

Q: Can you share what people shared with you?

A: I can sum up it in one word: revival. This week of prayer and fasting is going to be an inflection point that leads our congregation in a time of revival and spiritual growth.

Q: What about you Pastor, did the Lord speak to you in a specific way?

A: The one specific message that I received from the Lord comes from the theme verse for the week, *"My God will meet all your needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus.*" I felt God tell me that He will meet our needs, <u>not</u> according to our needs, but according to <u>the riches of His glory</u>. I felt God speaking to me at several other times during the week but each of them can be summed up in that theme verse.

Q: What do we do now?

A: First, I believe that we have to wait for the Lord's timing to answer our prayer. The week of prayer and fasting was an act of faith that God will provide the resources to accomplish His mission. God's timing is always perfect but sometimes slower than we would like. While we wait I would encourage you to continue to pray.

Q: How should we pray?

A: Pray that God will provide for us the resources (time, talent and treasure) so that we can accomplish the mission that He has given us. For specific prayers I would encourage you to look at the devotional that was published for the week of prayer and fasting.

Q: How do you hope God will act?

A: As I said in my initial sermon, I hope God will answer our prayer His way and that when His answer comes we will know that God has acted and that God should receive all the glory.

Q: Are the staff and lay leadership making any plans for the future?

A: Yes. The annual meeting is coming up in January so we are already working on the 2018 budget. We are currently creating a budget that is about the same dollar amount as the 2017 budget. However, that could change depending on how we finish this year financially. I am also pulling together a team of leaders that can advise me on future staffing levels depending on our yearly giving. Both the budget and changes in staffing would be brought before the council prior to the annual meeting and the budget, of course, would be approved by the congregation at the annual meeting on Sunday, January 28 at 11:30am.

Q: In light of the past couple years, how do you feel about our congregation?

A: I am hopeful. Discover Church is a very special place. In my Gideon moment sermon, I shared a conversation I had with a visitor who confirmed that reality. Just recently, I had a similar conversation with a board member of Hospitality House who shared how unique and special he thought our congregation was. I heard similar things from many of you. Add to this that we continue to try to improve our ability to *invite all people to discover their full life in Christ*. Several examples include our overall hospitality on Sunday mornings, more fellowship/belong events, our growing Life Groups ministry and a new ministry that you will hear more about called "Discover Church Serves."

Childcare for children up to age 5:

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY CLASSES SUNDAY MORNING'S AT 9:15AM

Nursery, 6 weeks to age 3

A staff that LOVES babies, and special developmental toys for the many stages of interest for babies to toddlers is our strength. Mouthed toys are washed weekly. Special snacks for babies and toddlers, as well as sippy cups are used each week. The highest standards of safety are maintained. Your child will feel loved, safe and cared for.

3's Class

This class is taught by a seasoned veteran and has a wonderful routine. Puppets, plenty of helpers, snacks, activities and a fantastic array of children's toys will initially encourage your child. Nurture, Bible time, snacks, crafts and play make this a favorite time for our current children.

4's & 5's Class

This class is for ages 4 years to Kindergarten. Opening activities, Bible time, group activities, snack time and a craft time are the Sunday routine. Allowing time for our children to play together is also part of the Sunday routine. Children learn the basic foundations of faith in units that last about a month.

Boys 1st and 2nd Grade Class

Lessons that are a foundation to our faith are taught with a healthy mix of object lessons, activities and teaching that boys of this age can understand.

Girls 1st and 2nd Grade Class

Lessons that are a foundation to our faith are taught with object lessons, songs, crafts and relational ministry.

Combined Boys and Girl's 3rd and 4th Grade

Foundational lessons of faith are taught with object lessons, activities and games. More emphasis is put on life application through prayer, discussions and relational ministry.

5th and 6th grades
